Our mission and history:

P.G. Chambers School's mission is to be a leader in the education and development of children with disabilities and in increasing the children's confidence in their individual abilities, preparing them to engage in the community, and expanding their capacity to lead full, productive lives. *Discovering the unique potential within every child* is at the heart of our mission and inspires us to provide exceptional, innovative services for the children we serve.

In 1954, the vision of a small group of parents convinced an entire community to support the development of a school and therapy center for their children with disabilities, and the Morris County Society for Crippled Children & Adults incorporated that same year. In 1968, the organization changed its name to the Easter Seal Society of Morris County. By 1976, the organization had developed comprehensive therapy and education programs, providing services for 225 children from Morris County. The Board of Trustees voted to become an independent organization in 1991 and disaffiliated from the Easter Seals, changing its name to The Children's Center for Therapy and Learning. The Center continued to grow and in 1993 moved from Morris Plains to a larger facility in Cedar Knolls, becoming a regional provider serving 500 children each year. As a result of rapid growth and long waiting lists, the organization completed an addition to the Cedar Knolls facility in 2005, nearly doubling its size. In celebration of its 50th anniversary, and to honor long-time Board member and benefactor Patti Chambers, the school was re-named P.G. Chambers School.

Throughout its history, P.G. Chambers School has responded to the needs of children and families with professional, high quality, caring services. Today, P.G. Chambers School is a leader in the field of special education and therapy services for children with disabilities. P.G. Chambers School is credentialed as both an Approved Private School for Students with Disabilities and an Approved Clinic and Agency by the New Jersey Department of Education. The organization is one of the region's most comprehensive educational and therapeutic service providers, serving children from eleven counties in northern New Jersey.

Our programs:

The **Community Services Program** provides on-site related services, consultations, and training for students in public and private schools. The services include direct occupational, physical, and speech therapy services; feeding and assistive technology evaluations; special education and assistive technology consultations; and workshops and seminars.

The **Assistive Technology (AT) Program** provides children with the appropriate equipment and technology to support them in reaching academic and developmental goals. Children benefit from assistive technology clinics in equipment, orthotics, and splinting. They receive AT assessments to trial equipment and technology that can support movement, communication, and access to education. Our AT program provides comprehensive AT evaluations to students at area private and public schools to support the student in their own classroom.

The **School Program** serves 110 children, preschool through 8th grade, with multiple, complex disabilities from eleven counties in northern New Jersey. Students engage in a full-day, year-round academic program, including therapeutic services and curriculum adaptions to meet each child's specific needs. In addition, P.G. Chambers School has a collaborative high school program in partnership with Randolph Township Public Schools called PG RISE at Randolph.

Our Comprehensive Early Intervention Program provides education and therapy services to children from birth to three years of age in their homes and their childcare settings.

PGCS serves children without regard to socio-economic or ethnic background. Children and students are accepted based on the services they need and come to us via referrals from the State and public school districts.
