LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION: STUDENTS SHINE IN STOP MOTION ANIMATION RESIDENCY

In April, MorrisArts provided a Stop Motion Animation Residency for our students. Under the guidance of the MorrisArts visiting artists and the School's assistive technology experts, the students created three enchanting stop motion videos. With each component of the project - brainstorming, creating artwork, narration recording and animation production - students were thrilled to be "making movies."

The start of the residency was marked by an incredible moment as students brainstormed



the components of their respective class themes. The K-2 class chose to explore emotions and feelings, the 3rd-5th graders focused on growing a garden, and the middle schoolers selected cooking as their theme. In total, students took more than 3,600 pictures for the project!

What is stop motion animation?

Stop motion animation is an advanced flipbook-style form of animation. It involves physically manipulating objects within individually photographed frames. As each frame is played in sequence, the technique creates the effect of objects moving independently.

The P.G. Chambers School's Spring Music and Arts Festival offered an outstanding showcase of student talent throughout two days of performances.



he festival launched with impressive performances from our middle school students, who captivated families and friends in attendance with music and dance from around the world. Highlights included a special rendition of the French classic, "Alouette," which featured students taking turns to participate in the chorus of the song. The next day, the spotlight shifted to the preschoolers, who gathered in a circle and wowed the crowd with their choreography.

In addition to the live performances, the festival included an art exhibit that transformed the gymnasium into a gallery. The walls were lined with a mix of student paintings and drawings.

The festival's success was bolstered by the strong turnout from the school community. Families and friends celebrated the students' performances and showed their support for the art exhibit. P.G. All funds raised through events support our children's mobility, communication, and educational needs and allow us to continue our work of discovering the unique potential within every child.




